How to Declare the Major in Religious Studies

- To declare the undergraduate major in Religious Studies, just fill out this form.
- The major in Religious Studies requires 30 credit hours.
- The minor in Religious Studies only requires 15 credit hours. With a few more classes, you could acquire a Bachelor's degree in Religious Studies.

How to Apply for the M.A. in Religious Studies

- The M.A. in Religious Studies program approaches the academic study of religion and religions
 from a variety of critical and interdisciplinary perspectives, with an emphasis placed on the global
 and multicultural aspects of religion.
- The M.A. application is completely electronic via the Charlotte Graduate School website.
- Exceptional undergraduate students at Charlotte may apply for the Early Entry Program and begin
 work toward the graduate degree before completion of the Bachelor's degree.

<u>Dr. Barbara Thiede - Teaching Professor - Judaic</u> Studies


